A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday 17th November

As he went out of the temple, Jesus said, Seest thou these great buildings? there shall not be left one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down... Peter and James and John and Andrew asked him privately, Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign when all these things shall be fulfilled? And Jesus [said] Take heed lest any man deceive you: for many shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ; and shall deceive many. And when ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars, be ye not troubled: for such things must needs be; but the end shall not be yet. For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: and there shall be earthquakes in divers places, and there shall be famines and troubles: these are the beginnings of sorrows.

AV (King James Bible)

As he came out of the temple, Jesus said, "Do you see these great buildings? There will not be left here one stone upon another, that will not be thrown down."... Peter and James and John and Andrew asked him privately, "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign when these things are all to be accomplished?" And Jesus [said], "Take heed that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he!' and they will lead many astray. And when you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places, there will be famines; this is but the beginning of the birth-pangs."

As Jesus was leaving the Temple, [he said] "You see these great buildings? Not a single stone will be left standing on another; every one will be thrown down!" ... Peter, James, John and Andrew said to him privately, "Tell us, when will these things happen? What sign will there be that all these things are going to be accomplished?" So [esus [said]: "Be very careful that no one deceives you. Many are going to come in my name and say, 'I am he', and will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, don't be alarmed. Such things are bound to happen, but the end is not yet. Nation will take up arms against nation and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in different places and terrible famines. But this is only the beginnings of the pains." **J B Phillips**

As he walked away from the Temple, Jesus said, "There's not a stone in the whole works that is not going to end up in a heap of rubble." ... Peter, James, John, and Andrew got him off by himself and asked, "Tell us, when is this going to happen? What sign will we get that things are coming to a head?" Jesus began, "Watch out for doomsday deceivers. Many leaders are going to show up with forged identities claiming, 'I'm the One.' They will deceive a lot of people. When you hear of wars and rumored wars, keep your head and don't panic. This is routine history, and no sign of the end. Nation will fight nation and ruler fight ruler, over and over. Earthquakes will occur in various places. There will be famines. But these things are nothing compared to what's coming." The Message

Mark 13 is a chapter of apocalyptic prophecy. In ch.11 Jesus drove the moneylenders out of the temple, so it's not surprising that ch.13 begins with the coming destruction of the temple, before proceeding to wars and earthquakes, the appearance of false prophets and false Messiahs, persecution and ultimately the "coming of the Son of Man". The temple was in fact destroyed by the Romans in AD70, around the time Mark's gospel was written, which would have lent weight and credibility to these prophecies. The sequence of events foretold is carefully constructed, with warnings not to leap to premature conclusions, to be awake and alert at all times, to be prepared for persecutions, and not to heed false prophets. It's clear from Paul's letters, written in the 50s AD, that the early church lived in expectation of Jesus' imminent return, a source of hope but also of anxiety. It can be hard for modern Christians to read these prophecies, knowing that these "end time" events did not happen when Jesus seems to be saying they would.

Lord help us, as we live through troubling times, not to be taken in by the certainties of false prophets, but to live our lives as faithful Christians, mindful that "here is no abiding city"; may our lives be shaped by our knowledge that our hope and peace, and final resting place, is in you.
