#### A reflection on this week's readings

### From the readings for Sunday 19 January 2025

Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit... But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom ...to another *divers* kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues: but all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will.

#### AV (King James Bible)

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit ... To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom ... to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are inspired by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills.

#### RSV

Men have different gifts, but it is the same Spirit who gives them... Each man is given his gift by the Spirit that he may make the most of it. One man's gift by the Spirit is to speak with wisdom... to another speech in different tongues. Behind all these gifts is the operation of the same Spirit, who distributes to each individual man, as he wills.

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit gives them ... The Spirit's presence is shown in some way in each person for the good of all. The Spirit gives one person a message full of wisdom ... to one person he gives the ability to speak in strange tongues, and to another he gives the ability to explain what is said. But it is one and the same Spirit who does all this; as he wishes, he gives a different gift to each person.

#### **Good News Bible**

We know more about Paul's church community at Corinth than any other early church. Apart from a variety of sexual scandals, they were prone to religious factionalism, class division and exclusiveness during the Lord's Supper, chaotic competitiveness and showing off in worship. Yet Paul, at least in this first letter, doesn't give up on a vision of them as a true community living "in Christ", literally the "body of Christ" in the world, and chapters 12 and 13 are at the heart of that vision. Chapter 13 is often called the "hymn to love" and is perhaps over-familiar from wedding services; some preachers get quite grumpy about this, not because it's entirely inappropriate in that context but because Paul is actually making a point about the Church, and it's not at all a dewy-eyed or sentimental one.

So chapter 12 is the necessary groundwork and scene-setting for the lyrical climax of chapter 13. Paul gives a long list of "gifts of the Spirit", and in doing so offers a rare insight, though possibly not a complete one, into what an early Christian prayer meeting would have been like. I've shortened the list drastically, but it includes prophecy, miracles and healing as well as wisdom and the gifts associated with "speaking in tongues". You get the impression of a group dominated by spiritual "performers", each convinced that their gift is the most important one. Yet Paul insists that we are *all* given gifts by the Spirit "for the good of all".

The second half of chapter 12 introduces the "church as body of Christ" idea with an elaborately worked-out comparison between the church community and the human body, in which all the organs, including those "lower in dignity", have a vital part to play. I must confess that, though I get the point, I have at times found this overlong, clunky and not up to the level of what precedes and follows it. I shared this view in a recent discussion group, and someone who works a lot with young children said that the children had fun exploring the idea, and genuinely did seem to take on board the point being made. I felt gently and not inappropriately rebuked; we are all prone to privilege our point of view, our contribution, over those of others, so we all stand in need of Paul's warning. So the love that Paul is talking about in chapter 13 is not primarily romantic love, but a joyful acceptance and appreciation of the value of all those we are in community with.

Lord, guard us from the temptations of arrogance and self-satisfaction, and open our eyes to the unique value of all those with whom we share our lives in the church community, that we may see the love and the humanity of your son Jesus Christ reflected in them. Amen
