A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday 23 February

And before the throne *there was* a sea of glass like unto crystal... and round about the throne, were four beasts. And the first beast *was* like a lion, and the second beast like a calf, and the third beast had a face as a man, and the fourth beast *was* like a flying eagle... They rest not day and night, saying, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty... And when those beasts give glory and honour and thanks to him that sat on the throne, the four and twenty elders fall down before him, and worship him, and cast their crowns before the throne, saying, Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.

AV (King James Bible)

And before the throne there is as it were a sea of glass, like crystal. And round the throne, on each side of the throne, are four living creatures: the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with the face of a man, and the fourth living creature like a flying eagle... Day and night they never cease to sing, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty!" And whenever the living creatures give glory and honor and thanks to him who is seated on the throne, the twenty-four elders fall down before him and worship him; they cast their crowns before the throne, singing, "Worthy art thou, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for thou didst create all things, and by thy will they existed and were created."

Before the Throne it was like a clear crystal sea. Prowling around the Throne were Four Animals. The first Animal like a lion, the second like an ox, the third with a human face, the fourth like an eagle in flight... they chanted night and day, never taking a break: "Holy, holy, holy is God our Master, Sovereign-Strong". Every time the Animals gave glory and honor and thanks to the One Seated on the Throne, the Twenty-four Elders would fall prostrate before Him and worship Him. They threw their crowns at the foot of the Throne, chanting, "Worthy, O Master! Yes, our God! Take the glory! The honor! The power! You created it all; it was created because you wanted it."

The Message

The book of Revelation has always been controversial. It was only definitively accepted into the NT canon in the 4th century. The early Protestant reformers (Luther, Zwingli and Calvin) all had doubts about it – ironically, since it was enthusiastically taken up by embattled Protestants in the later 16th century and since. Its haunting and disturbing visions of wars in Heaven and on earth have been hard for later Christians to interpret. Are they divinely inspired prophecies which we can read off as referring (from our point in time) to past and/or future historical events? Attempts to do so have been highly divisive, and many have doubted whether this is a useful way to read the text. It has been found profoundly relevant where Christians and others are suffering oppression and injustice (e.g. Dietrich Bonhoeffer in Nazi Germany, liberation theologians in modern poor and developing countries).

It was probably written (almost certainly *not* by the author of John's gospel, despite early tradition) around the end of the 1st century, somewhere in or near modern Turkey, and its anguished and often vengeful tone presumably reflects a period of persecution by the Roman authorities, represented as the "whore of Babylon". It has profoundly affected the Western imagination (e.g. William Blake's prophetic books, Ingmar Bergman's *The Seventh Seal*, or cultural tropes like the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse). In particular it has inspired many of our images of eternal life in heaven; today's passage is echoed in Wesley's hymn *Love divine, all loves excelling* – "Till we <u>cast our crowns before thee</u>/ Lost in wonder, love and praise" – and Rowley's *I will sing the wondrous story* – "Sing it with the saints in glory/ Gathered <u>by the crystal sea</u>". The four "living creatures" or *hayyoth* are found in Ezekiel 1:10 and since the 2nd century have been widely taken to represent the four gospel writers (Mark, Luke, Matthew and John), again showing how the symbolism of Revelation has been deeply absorbed into our culture and tradition.

Lord, help us to appreciate the intense prayerfulness of this and many other passages in Revelation, and to try and come to a true appreciation of this often difficult and disturbing book.
