A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday 23rd March

All our fathers were ... baptized unto Moses ... and did all eat the same spiritual meat; and did all drink the same spiritual drink: for they drank of that spiritual Rock that was Christ. But with many of them God was not well pleased: for they were overthrown in the wilderness... Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition... Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall. There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God *is* faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear *it*.

AV (King James Bible)

Our fathers were all ... baptized into Moses ... and all ate the same supernatural food and all drank the same supernatural drink. For they drank from the supernatural Rock which was Christ. Nevertheless with most of them God was not pleased; for they were overthrown in the wilderness... Now these things happened to them as a warning, but they were written down for our instruction... Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall. No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your strength, but with the temptation will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

Our ancestors were all ... "baptised" into Moses ... They all shared the same spiritual food and drank the same spiritual drink (for they drank from the spiritual rock which was Christ). Yet in spite of all these wonderful experiences many of them failed to please God, and left their bones in the desert... Now these things ... were written down to be a warning to us... So let the man who feels sure of his standing today be careful that he does not fall tomorrow. No temptation has come your way that is too hard for flesh and blood to bear. But God can be trusted not to allow you to suffer any temptation beyond your powers of endurance. He will see to it that every temptation has a way out, so that it will never be impossible for you to bear it.

Our ancestors ... were all baptized as followers of Moses... All ate the same spiritual bread and drank the same spiritual drink. They drank from the spiritual rock that was Christ himself. But even then God was not pleased with most of them, and so their dead bodies were scattered over the desert... All these things were written down as a warning for us... If you think you are standing firm you had better be careful that you do not fall. Every test that you have experienced is the kind that normally comes to people. But God keeps his promise, and he will not allow you to be tested beyond your power to remain firm; at the time you are put to the test, he will give you the strength to endure it, and so provide you with a way out.

Good News Bible

For Paul his largely Gentile converts to Christianity were the new "seed of Abraham", so it makes sense that he expects them to regard the Israelites of the Exodus as *their* ancestors. He sees the Israelites as being "baptised" by passing through the waters of the Red Sea, and sees the rock from which Moses drew water with his staff as representing Christ, thus starting a long tradition of interpreting events and objects in the OT as symbolically "prefiguring" the Christian redemption. In today's reading we find on the one hand a stern warning that we're in spiritual danger if we don't take on board in our own lives the dire consequences the Israelites faced through disobedience to God's commands. On the other hand we're reassured that, because God can be trusted, we won't be tested beyond our strength. Life as a Christian is morally serious, and sin has consequences, but we're not held to an inhuman standard of perfection. (Later in the chapter Paul gives the Corinthians some notably moderate and nuanced advice about not taking part in pagan rituals, but equally not cutting themselves off from all social interaction with their non-Christian neighbours.)

Lord, help us to discern the lines we need to draw in our own lives and, with the help of your Holy Spirit within us, to find the strength to choose well when faced with morally difficult decisions.
